- CONSIDERATE... never knowingly operates in such a way as to lessen the pleasure of others.
- LOYAL... offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs and the American Radio Relay League, through which Amateur Radio in the United States is represented nationally and internationally.
- PROGRESSIVE... with knowledge abreast of science, well-built and efficient station and operation above reproach.
- FRIENDLY... with slow and patient operation when requested, friendly advice and counsel to the beginner, kindly assistance, co-operation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the hallmarks of the amateur spirit.
- BALANCED... radio is a hobby never interfering with duties owed to his family, job, school or community.
- PATRIOTIC... station and skill always ready for service to country and community.

Radio Amateur's Code

- LOYAL... offering loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs and the American Radio Relay League, through which Amateur Radio in the United States is represented nationally and internationally.
 - Getting on the local repeater and complaining about its performance or running-down those who volunteer to work on the equipment is certainly not within the spirit of loyalty mentioned above. Grumbling that the repeater was in used in a parade, sports events or other public service event for a few hours on a Saturday morning doesn't cut it either regardless of how much contribution you had made towards the equipment fund.
 - Join the local radio club. Find the most active club in your area. Promote amateur radio on a local basis and allow your voice to be heard, *even your dissenting voice*. Volunteer where you can contribute your time, energy and expertise.

 - WITH “The Executive Committee shall give notice to the member of its decision prior to a vote on the question at least three days in advance of the vote. A member may share his/her opinion on the question of his/her membership with the Executive Committee prior to the vote.”

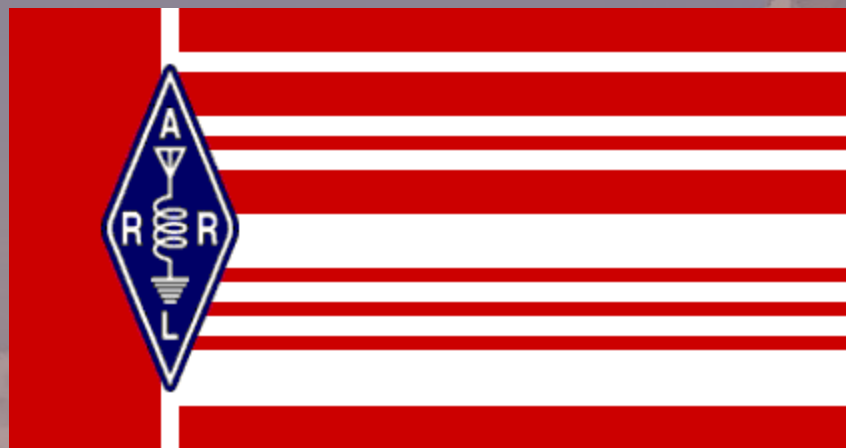
